WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEKEND:

HUNTER-REAY SEARCHES FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT WIN: Ryan Hunter-Reay has used a three-race win streak to take control of the IZOD IndyCar Series point standings. The Andretti Autosport driver leads Will Power by 34 points heading into Edmonton. Can Hunter-Reay become the first driver in six years to claim four straight wins?



CANADIANS SEEK STRONG FINISHES: James Hinchcliffe and Alex Tagliani will be looking to score a victory in front of their Canadian fans. Tagliani, who has never finished better than seventh in an Indy car race at Edmonton, has been to Victory Lane at the track, winning the NASCAR Canadian Tire Series support event in 2008. Hinchcliffe won the Firestone Indy Lights race in 2010, becoming the only Canadian to win an open-wheel race at Edmonton. Can Tag or Hinch find their way back to Victory Lane in Edmonton?
