**HELIO LOOKS TO PAD POINTS LEAD:** Helio Castroneves took control of the IZOD IndyCar Series points lead with a victory at Texas Motor Speedway and carries a 22-point advantage into the Milwaukee IndyFest. The Brazilian leads the Andretti Autosport duo of Marco Andretti (22 points back) and Ryan Hunter-Reay (27 points back).
